

Cattaraugus County Transfer Station Fees

Effective **March 1, 2012**, the following user fees are established for non-permitted users of County transfer stations:

- \$ 1.50 per 15 gallon garbage bag*, or equivalent**
- \$ 3.00 per 30 gallon garbage bag**, or equivalent**
- \$ 5.00 per item of miscellaneous solid waste
- \$ 20.00 per uncompacted cubic yard of solid waste***
- \$ 75.00 per ton of solid waste
- \$ 15.00 per refrigerant (Freon) containing appliance

* 15 gal. Bag is equivalent to tall white kitchen garbage bag

** 30 gal. Bag is equivalent to green, brown, or black garbage bag (not 45 gallon bags which will be charged \$4.50 and not 55 gallon carpenter-sized bags which will be charged \$6.00)

*** A standard-sized pickup truck loaded slightly above the original sides is three cubic yards; therefore a pickup truck load as described will be assessed a \$60.00 fee for disposal.

SPECIFIC RULES REGARDING TRANSFER STATIONS

1. **Bulky Items and Construction and Demolition Debris** shall be limited to 6 cubic yards per day, approximately two pickup truck loads as described below.
2. **Metal** shall be limited to 3 cubic yards per day.
3. **Garbage** shall be limited to 3 cubic yards per day at the smaller "Public Only" transfer stations. Larger quantities of garbage are accepted at the Salamanca and Dayton transfer stations.
4. **Yard Waste** must be free of dirt and garbage, and is limited to 1 cubic yard or the equivalent of 5 - 30 gallon bags per day. Larger amounts can be taken to the Five Points or Farwell Composting sites.

NO COMMERCIAL COLLECTORS will be allowed at any sites other than the Salamanca and Dayton transfer stations.

THREE CUBIC YARDS is the equivalent of one standard size pickup truck loaded slightly above the original standard height of the sides. Loads cannot be brought in which exceed Federal and State regulations.

"PUBLIC ONLY" TRANSFER STATIONS are intended for the use of residential customers. Commercial waste should go to the Salamanca or Dayton transfer stations.

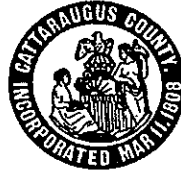

GENERAL TRANSFER STATION REGULATIONS

1. County personnel may inspect all loads. Loads containing unacceptable material will be prohibited from dumping until the unacceptable waste is removed from the load. After the collector dumps the acceptable waste, the collector will reload the unacceptable waste and return it to the generator. After inspection by the transfer station operator, the collector shall place recyclable materials in proper containers.
2. The general types of waste accepted at transfer stations are:
 - **Garbage** – Includes, but is not limited to, general household trash, paper (other than newspaper), cardboard, and similar household materials.
 - **Recyclables** – Includes, but is not limited to, acceptable glass bottles and jars, plastics, tin cans, newspapers, household and vehicle batteries, magazines and unwanted “junk” mail, cardboard and paperboard, and small quantities of yard waste. All recyclables must be properly prepared in accordance with guidelines established by the Commissioner of Public Works.
 - **Metal** – Includes, but is not limited to, stoves, appliances, and metal wastes generated around the home. Excessively large pieces of metal such as autobodies will not be accepted. Non-metal attachments must be removed.
 - **Bulky Items** – Includes, but is not limited to, furniture, pallets, rugs, and mattresses.
 - **Demolition Debris** – Shall be accepted at all stations, but there will be a limit of 6 cubic yards per day from the generator.
3. The general types of **unacceptable waste** at transfer stations includes, but is not limited to:

➤ Septic Tank Waste	➤ Waste Oil
➤ Liquid Waste	➤ Manure
➤ Pesticides/Chemicals	➤ Unpermitted Industrial Waste
➤ Sealed Containers/Drums	➤ Explosives
➤ Hazardous Waste	➤ Regulated Medical Waste
➤ Asbestos Waste	
4. No wastes generated outside of Cattaraugus County will be accepted at any County transfer station, except by prior arrangement with the Commissioner of Public Works.
